Report of Senate Committee on Assessments and Taxation.

Made by S. Hughes during the "Hold
Up at Salem."

BANKS SHALL KEEP A CORRECT LIST
OF THEIR STOCK HOLDERS.

Sec. 32.—In every bank and banking
office there shall be kept at all times a
full and correct list of the names and
residence of the stock holders, owners
and parties interested therein, showing
amount of capital stock, the par value,
the number of shares and the amount
held, owned or controlled by each party
in interest, which statement or list shall
be subject to the inspection of the officers
authorized by law to assess property for
taxation, and it shall be the duty of the
county officer or cashier of each bank or
banking institution to furnish the assessor
with a duplicate copy of such list ver-
ified by oath to the effect that the same
is true, which shall be filed by the assessor
in the office of the county clerk and
preserved by him.

BANK MAY RETAIN ENOUGH OF DIVI-
DEND TO PAY TAX OF STOCK-HOLDERS.

Sec. 34.—To secure the payment of
taxes on banks, bank stock or banking
capital it shall be and it is hereby made
the duty of every bank or managing of-
ficer or officers thereof to retain so much
of any dividend or dividends belonging
to such stock holders or owners as shall
be necessary to pay any taxes levied
upon their shares of stock or interest
respectively, until it shall be made to
appear to such bank or its officers that
such taxes have been paid; and any of-
ficer of any such bank who shall pay
over or authorize the paying over of any
such dividends or dividend or any por-
tion thereof contrary to the provisions
of this section shall thereby become li-
able for such tax, and if said tax shall not
be paid the tax collector where such
bank is located shall sell such shares or
interest to pay the same in like manner
and with like effect as other personal
property is sold on execution and give
the purchaser a certificate therefor which
shall vest in him all the title and interest
of such tax payer in or to such shares or
interest, and shall entitle the holder of
such certificate to the transfer of said
stock to him on the books of the bank.

POLL TAXES.—ASSESSOR TO ASSESS
COUNTY, POLL AND ROAD POLL TAX.

Sec. 35.—It shall be the duty of the
assessor to assess a poll tax upon every
male inhabitant of his county over
twenty-one and under fifty years of age,
one dollar for county purposes and three
dollars for the benefit of the road district
in which such person resides; which last
named tax shall be collected as other
road taxes are collected.

ASSESSOR MUST COLLECT POLL TAX.

Sec. 36.—The assessor is hereby em-
powered and directed to collect the poll
tax herein provided for, and may levy
upon and destrain any property belong-
ing to any person subject to said poll tax
for its payment; provided, that in cases
of persons having real estate in the
county, the poll tax herein provided for
may be added to his property tax, and
collected in the same manner.

DUTY OF ASSESSORS.

Sec. 37.—County Assessors shall re-
ceive three dollars for each day necessar-
ily employed in discharging their duties
under this act; and deputy assessors three
dollars per day for the time actually and
necessarily employed in assessing their
respective districts, to be paid in each
case out of the county treasury. If ac-
tually necessary, the county court may
employ additional clerical aid to the as-
sessor.

INSURANCE, TELEGRAPH AND OTHER
COMPANIES.—TELEGRAPH, ELECTRIC
LIGHT, PLANK ROAD, TURNPIKE WAGON
ROAD AND OTHER COMPANIES PAY ON
GROSS EARNINGS.

Sec. 38.—Each and every electric light
company or corporation and every plank
road, turnpike road, wagon road company
or corporation, and every bridge com-
pany or corporation doing business in
this state, wherever organized or incor-
porated, shall on the first day of April
of every year after this act takes effect,
make out and file with the secretary of
state a statement verified by the presi-
dent or secretary, for any such company
or corporation showing the gross amount
of money or notes received by any such
company or corporation for or on the ac-
count of rents, fares, tolls, license or
other wise during the year the next be-
fore the said first day of April, which
amount of gross receipts the secretary of
state shall forthwith certify to the state
treasurer, and every such company or
corporation shall there upon pay to the
state treasurer, three per centum on all
such gross receipts, and upon failure to
make such payment, the treasurer shall
forthwith proceed to collect the same by
destraint and sale of the goods and chat-
tels of such delinquent corporations in
the same manner and like effect as pro-
vided in section — of this act. The
above payments shall be in lieu of all

taxes except on real property which shall
be listed and assessed as is elsewhere
provided.

INSURANCE COMPANIES NOT ORGANIZED
UNDER THE LAWS OF THIS STATE MUST
PAY ON GROSS EARNINGS.

Sec. 39.—Every insurance company
not organized under the laws of this state
and doing business herein shall on or be-
fore the first day of April, 1898, and on
or before the first day of April of each
year thereafter report to the secretary of
state of the gross amount of all such re-
ceipts, whether in money or notes, re-
ceived or accruing from business trans-
acted in the state of Oregon on account
of insurance premiums for the preceding
calendar year the truth of which state-
ment shall be verified by the oath of the
president, secretary, managing agent,
director, general or other agent or attor-
ney, in this state, or such company.

The secretary of state shall file such
statement in his office and certify the
amount of such gross receipts to the
state treasurer.

At the time of filing such statement in
each year such insurance company shall
pay to the state treasurer two per cen-
tum, on such gross receipts.

And any such insurance company fail-
ing or refusing for more than thirty days
to render an accurate account of its pre-
mium receipts as herein provided and to
pay the required per centum, shall be
fined \$100 for each additional day such
report or payment is delayed, and the
secretary of state is hereby required to
cause an action to be instituted in the
name of the state of Oregon in any court
of competent jurisdiction to recover such
penalty. And such company shall be
prohibited from doing business in this
state until such payment is made. Its
real property, if any, shall be listed and
assessed as other real property.

EXPRESS COMPANIES MUST PAY ON
GROSS EARNINGS.

Sec. 40.—Any corporation not incor-
porated under the laws of this state con-
veying to, from or through this state,
goods, wares, merchandise, money, pack-
ages, gold, silver plate, or other articles
by express over the line of any railroad
company, stage or steamboat company
or by or under any contract of the
manager, lessee, agents or receivers
thereof, (not including railroad compa-
nies engaged in the ordinary transpor-
tation of merchandise or other articles in
this,) shall be deemed to be an express
company.
