England's poet laureate, is being rudely criticized these days for his jubilee ode, the world forgetting that his immediate predecessor, whose genius is now unquestioned, was not particularly happy in his state effusions. Of Tennyson's distinctively laureate poems only "The Charge of the Light Brigade" is worthy of him, none of the other occasions which he was called upon to celebrate officially being inspiring or anything but commonplace.

The early English Kings provided their private poets with a hoghead of wine to fire their fancy but the royal bounty would have to be of Victoria's favorite Scottish whiskey to arouse much enthusiasm over an old woman in her dotage and her long reign devoid of personal achievements, save frequent pillaging of the British treasury for herself and numerous progeny.

That the Queen has had no part in affairs of state is commonly known but the past week over all the world have been heard glorifications of her womanliness, the pattern of wife and mother now the speechmakers would have us believe. Poor Prince Albert proved himself a modern Job in his patient endurance of the whims and hasty temper of his royal spouse, and not monuments and memorials but treatment during life prove a wife's devotion. As for the rest a candid public will hardly give much credit to the mother who brought up surly Princess Louise, the rake Prince of Wales and Leopold the blue blooded bilk. Britons may be forgiven for trying to delude themselves into contentment with their royal family but it is nauseating to see Americans slop over on such subjects.

We are told her majesty limits her court chaplain in his communion with Deity and it is no less likely that the genius of her pensioned poet is kept within due bounds.

TIME TO REMEMBER CUBA.

Colonel Aguirre, the Cuban patriot, well-known in Washington, who has lost five brothers, officers in the Cuban army, asks the press of the country to urge in their columns that in the Fourth of July exercises the orators of the day shall prominently treat of the Cuban question and bring out American sentiment in favor of the immediate granting of belligerent rights to the struggling people, as the first step toward ultimate recognition of the independence of Cuba.

He desires to call attention to the organization of the National Relief Association for Cuba, in aid of the American Red Cross in Washington, under the auspices of some of the most prominent women in America. Its object is to raise funds to send the American Red Cross to Cuba. Contributions will be received by Mrs. Senator J. C. A title which was good enough for a Franklin ought to be for our modern diplomats, and certain it is that none of these latter day parvenus has accomplished the work or reflected upon his country the credit that did the printer philosopher with his plain ways and common sense. A republic makes a laughing stock of itself in imitating monarchical manners but wins respect by consistency.

We wonder how many citizens have had to jump hastily from the sidewalk into the ditch to avoid being run down by bicyclists who seem to delight in quickly turning corners and racing at breakneck speed down the slopes. It is difficult to perceive their approach as many carry neither bells nor lights. Would it not be a good plan for the city council to pass an ordinance prohibiting scorching on the sidewalks and requiring all cyclists to ring a bell when approaching pedestrians.
