### ORDINANCE NO. 93.

An Ordinance to License, Tax, and Regulate Certain Businesses and Professions within the City of Forest Grove, Oregon; and to Regulate the Running at Large of Certain Animals.

The City of Forest Grove does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, or corporation, to keep, conduct, or carry on, within the corporate limits of the City of Forest Grove, Washington County, Oregon, any tavern, bank, hardware store, shoe store, harness shop, tin shop, feed store, drug store, confectionery store, butcher shop, creamery, laundry, blacksmith shop, wagonmaker's shop, millinery store, printing office, bicycle livery, domestic telephone exchange, livery stable, general merchandise store, grocery store, commission house, produce exchange, furniture store, barber shop, photograph gallery, or sash and door factory, without first having obtained a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation, to keep, conduct, or carry on, any jewelry store, or to engage in the business of watch or clock repairing, or to engage in the business of making or mending of boots or shoes, or to engage in the business of real estate agent, cigar making, or broker, or to practice the profession of a lawyer, physician, or dentist, within the corporate limits of the city of Forest Grove, Oregon, without having first obtained a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful to use or operate any steam wood saw for sawing wood within the corporate limits of said city of Forest Grove, without the owner or person operating the same having first obtained a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful to keep, conduct, or carry on, any wood yard within the corporate limits of said city of Forest Grove without having first obtained a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance; and every person who shall purchase wood and store the same within or near the corporate limits of said city of Forest Grove, or who shall retail wood so purchased and stored to the inhabitants of said city of Forest Grove, shall be deemed to be the keeper of a wood yard, and shall pay a license accordingly.

Section 5. The rate of license for the keeping, conducting, or carrying on the business or businesses, and for engaging in the practice of the professions hereinbefore mentioned, shall be according to the following schedule, to-wit:

Section 6. A license may be granted to any person or persons, firm, or corporation, mentioned in this ordinance for the period of six months upon payment of one-half of the amount specified in the foregoing schedule of rates; provided, that this shall not apply to the owners, keepers, or operators, of any wood saw or bicycle livery.

Section 7. It shall be unlawful for the owner or owners of any milch cow or cows to permit the same to run at large within the corporate limits of the city of Forest Grove, Oregon, without the owner or owners having first obtained a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 8. The rate of license for a milch cow running at large shall be \$4.00 per year, payable quarterly in advance.

Section 9. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to conflict with the provisions of ordinances 51 and 68 of the city of Forest Grove, Oregon; or to authorize the licensing or running at large of any animals not permitted to run at

large by the provisions of said ordinances.

Section 10. Every person desiring to keep, conduct, or carry on, any business house, or to practice any profession, or to allow any milch cow to run at large within said city, shall pay to the city recorder of said city of Forest Grove, Oregon, the sum of money required by this ordinance for the business or profession in which he desires to engage, or for the cow or cows which he desires to run at large, and such city recorder shall issue to the applicant a license for the period for which the applicant has paid; provided, that no license shall be issued for a less period than six months, except for milch cows which may be issued for three months, and no license shall be issued to the owners or operators of any wood saw, or keeper of any bicycle livery for a period less than one year.

Section 11. Every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by fine not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00, or to be imprisoned in the city jail not exceeding 20 days, or by both; such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section 12. All ordinances, and parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are repealed.

Anton Pfanner, the bank president, who disappeared from his home at Forest Grove June 9 and whose whereabouts has been an unsolved mystery ever since, has been discovered. His brother-in-law Leopold Huff, who has been searching for him, has found him in a hospital in Victoria, B. C. He was suffering from nervous prostration, and had been mentally unbalanced; but when Huff reached Victoria his condition was much improved, and he will be ready to come back to Forest Grove in a little while.

Huff at once wrote a letter to Chief of Police Barry, thanking him for his efforts in searching for his brother-in-law, and informing him that he need trouble himself no further about the case, as Pfanner would be now under his care. The letter was received yesterday.

A few weeks ago Huff learned that a man answering to Pfanner's description had been in a hospital in Victoria. He immediately left for that city, and was rewarded by finding his missing relative.

Anton Pfanner, who was president of the Forest Grove bank, and a man of reputed wealth, left Forest Grove the morning of June 9. His brother received a note from him the next day, requesting him to close the bank. The note came in a registered letter from Portland. An assignment was made to Samuel Hughes and A. Hinman, prominent business men of Forest Grove, for the benefit of his creditors.

The next day Dr. Ward and Rev. Mr. Clapp came to Portland to search for Pfanner, but succeeded in finding no trace of him. The police were notified, and Chief Barry made thorough search, closely watching all outgoing trains, but no trace of the missing banker could be found.

It was feared that Pfanner had committed suicide, but Mr. Huff, his brother-in-law, who came to Portland from his home in Washington shortly after Pfanner disappeared, scouted the idea, and set persistently at work on the search. After a month of hard work his efforts were crowned with success.

The theory which was held by the police that Pfanner was in concealment in Portland a week or two ago is exploded by his discovery. It is not known how long he has been in Victoria; but so much publicity was given to his disappearance that it would have been impossible for him to reach Victoria after the first day or two without being discovered.—Sunday's Oregonian.
