

the decision of the supreme court of the United States, holding that the lands in the so-called quadrant, in Washington county, were forfeited to the United States and did not belong to the railroad company, the question has arisen as to the rights of the persons who purchased from the railroad company before the act of forfeiture was passed, to the moneys they paid to the railroad company for the lands they purchased.

Judge Williams was employed by the settlers and others who purchased from the railroad company, to recover the moneys paid for the lands which they purchased; and the railroad company, in order to avoid litigation and to make amicable settlement of the claims, though claiming that it had a good defense there to, proposes to those who paid for their lands in full to refund to them the amount of money which they paid, without interest from the time the payments were made; and as to those who made partial payments for their lands, the railroad company proposes to refund the principal amounts paid upon the contracts, but declines to refund the interest accruing under said contracts which was paid by the purchasers, claiming that, as the purchasers obtained possession of the lands under the contracts, the possession and use of the lands were a proper offset against any interest paid by the settlers upon their contracts of purchase.

Judge Williams is submitting the compromise of these claims, as proposed by the railroad company, to the several purchasers for their acceptance or rejection, and says that several of the settlers upon these lands have indicated their willingness to accept the proposition made by the railroad company, and he thinks it is quite probable that the proposition will be generally accepted by the settlers, as they will thereby get the money which the railroad company offers to refund to them without further trouble or expense.

This proposed compromise is the result of quite protracted negotiations between the railroad officials and Judge Williams representing the settlers. If the offer made by the railroad company is accepted, all the controversies which have been pending for years over these lands in the quadrant will be terminated.—Saturday's Oregonian.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 94.

An Ordinance to Amend Sections 1 and VI of Ordinance No. 21.

The City of Forest Grove does ordain as follows: Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 51 passed by the Common Council of the City of Forest Grove, Oregon, June 20, 1894, and approved by the Mayor, June 23, 1894, be amended to read as follows:

Section 1. No horses, mules, cattle, sheep, swine or goats shall be allowed to run at large or to be herded in any of the streets, alleys, parks, uninclosed private grounds, or public parks within the corporate limits of the City of Forest Grove, Oregon, during any of the hours of the day or night, except as hereinafter provided; 1st, Loose animals as above named, may be driven through the streets for any lawful purpose, provided they are so guarded as to prevent damage to the persons and property of citizens, and such animals are driven promptly as possible, and provided further the owner shall be responsible for all such damage done by such animals so driven, and any milch cow licensed under the provisions of Ordinance No. 93, of said City of Forest Grove, may run at large during the hours from 6 a. m. to 9 p. m. of the same day provided such cow shall wear attached to a suitable collar such tag as said city shall furnish for such purpose to designate cows so licensed and provided further all such tags so furnished must be returned to the Recorder of said city at the expiration of the period for which license has been paid by the person having such animal in charge.

Section 2. That Section VI of said Ordinance No. 51 be amended to read as follows:

Section 6. The owner or person having control of any animal named in Section 1 of this Ordinance, who shall permit or allow any of such animals to run at large contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, or shall violate any of the provisions of said Section 2 or shall permit any unlicensed cow to wear a tag, whether such tag be furnished by said city or is similar in form, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$100 or shall be imprisoned in the city jail for not exceeding twenty days, or by both such fines and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.
