Circuit Court.

The regular November term of Circuit
court began Monday with Judge T. A.
McBride presiding.

Judge McBride appointed J. A. Thorn-
burg and A. M. Collins court bailiffs,
and L. L. Whitcomb bailiff for the grand
jury.

The court's instructions to the grand
jury were quite long, it being especially
charged to avoid unnecessary expense.
The grand jury employed T. S. Weather-
ed as expert to examine the books of
the several county officers.

The trial of Gus Wachlin, for the mur-
der of John D. Ledrick, was set for De-
cember 8.

CHIPS.

Loudoners evidently believe in look-
ing gift horses in the mouth as was
shown recently when a member of the
mushroom aristocracy offered to present
the corporation with four hundred spec-
imens of the old masters as the nucleus
for a city art gallery. The lord mayor
hired an expert to examine the paint-
ings and then declined the proffered
present.

The anti-department store agitation is
again renewed because the Prince of
Wales recently patronized one of those
objectionable enterprises. The favored
merchant will probably hereafter ex-
hibit a sign "Bootmaker, Batchelor, Drug-
gist, Hairdresser, Grocer, Clothier,
Stationer, etc., to H. R. H., the Prince
of Wales."

The executive committee of the Na-
tional Sound Money league has just
voted another \$1000 for missionary work
in Oregon which insures another series
of tirades from the Oregonian against
those who stand on the St. Louis plat-
form and believe in the republican doc-
trine of bimetalism. "For good money
the Oregonian is making as strong a
fight as it knows how just as during the
presidential campaign it said it was
doing. Then it was six thousand dol-
lars from the Republican State Central
committee, now it is evidently making a
good thing out of the aforementioned
sound money league. There would
have been "good money" in it to enlist
the sympathy of its able and meretrici-
ous editor.

The Treasury receipts this month will
average nearly one million dollars per
day for each business day of the month.
All of this is accomplished under the
Dingley law, and without any material
revenue from the duty on sugar, as the
importers are now using up their large
stock of that article which was imported
before the new law went into effect. It
is estimated that the revenue from the
duty on sugar, when the present stock is
exhausted, will average \$5,000,000 a
month, which of itself will be sufficient
to bring the revenue up to a sum equal to
the ordinary expenditures of the Govern-
ment. With the increase which will
come from other articles, such as wool,
woolen goods, and other manufactures,
with which the country had been filled,
it is now perfectly apparent that the re-
venue produced under this law will be
ample.
