Equaled. HILLSBORO, Nov. 23 .- Never in the history of this county has the productiveness of 1897 been equaled. The increase in price of farm products has not been confined to grain but embraces all the principal products the farmers have to sell. Even the straw piles, which have heretofore usually been burned, in many instances this year have been baled and disposed of a a good profit. Hops and oats are probably the only crops that fall short of former years, the shortage in oats being due to better prospects in wheat, and in hops to the rain and mold at harvest time. The quality of the hops harvested is, however, reported by buyers to be the best in the state. A very careful and conservative estimate of the output of Washington county products for 1897 follows:
