Nor can our governor plead that under any circumstances, whatsoever, has the phraseology of our constitution made it his mandatory duty to appoint a senator, even to fill any vacancy, for while the language of the constitution is potential yet it is subjunctive in its character and expression. That he may appoint a senator to a vacancy under conditions fill contingently expressed is not the language of an imperative duty,



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
