THE WARNING OF HISTORY TO THE CENSORS OF THE PRESS

A press censorably has been estab lished at Cripple Creek by the muitary authorities who have proclaimed martial in . The provost marshal has taken passessing of the magor's air for painless extraction. office and threatened to cut off the district from the outsides world: by focking up the correspondents of the Deny r papers and to censor sali mate, ter to be sent to the Donver newspapers. It is announced that no publication reflecting on the government of the United States or state of Colorado will be tolerated. Such is a press report under date of December 6,

History tells how Charles, X of France signed an ordinance by which the liberty of the periodical press was suspended and there followed the three terrible days of July, the revolution against the family of Bourbon, and the uncrowning of Charles X

In 1695 when the English press became seditions John Milton advocated its freedom, saying: "Though all the winds of doctrine were let loose to play upon the earth, so truth be in the field, we do injuriously, by licensing and prohibiting, to mis doubt her strength. Let her and falsehood grappel, who ever knew truth put to the worse in a free and open encounter?" In 1803 Napoleon, having been greatly irritated by the articles published in England, asked that the government suppress the newspapers which published articles unfriendly to himself. He was informed that the press was free and beyond the power of the government to suppress.

Frederick the Great was accounted remarkable even among statesmen accustomed to the license of a free press for the steadfastness of mind with which he upheld its freedom when he himself was the subject of one of the most slinging lampoons ever written in the world.
