ANTI-SALOON FOREST GROVE

Forest Grove's voters at Monday's city election by an overwhelming majority, decided in favor of the Anti-Saloon ticket, and it is now up to those who were elected to make good their campaign promises. It may be that those pledges will be redeemed, that these enthusiastic newcomers who are now in office will do better than their prohibition predecessors here have done, but the temperance history of Forest Grove does not warrant undue enthusiasm till some results are seen. Not the closing for a few days will justify their election, that has been customary after every election for thirty-odd years, but the town must be dry for the entire twelve months during which this administration has charge of the city.

Principal Bates, as chairman of the Executive Committee of the Good Citizenship League, in a circular distributed just before election said, "Just previous to the special election of last July the Good Citizenship League gave assurance that if the people voted 'No' on the question of a licensed saloon, the League would use its best endeavor to have all selling of intoxicating liquor as a beverage in Forest Grove stopped." But evidently the liquor consumed in such quantities was not used as a beverage, perhaps only as a stomach douche, for its sale was not stopped nor were the best endeavors of the League visible to the naked eye.

Still the new city administration may be able to work a reform, and if it is a real reform, not merely the cleaning of the outside of the cup and of the plaster but the removal of the excess and extortion from within which has never yet been affected by any of the many previous reform movements, then Mayor Hoge and his associates will deserve well of their fellow citizens.

But the officers must prove them-

selves not merely anti-saloon but against every illegal sale within the city. In these columns will be told the success or failure of their efforts, colored only by such prejudice as comes from acquaintance with many previous efforts promising just as fairly but of which not one ever accomplished any lasting good.
