#### Arkansas Decision is That Nuisance May be Abated Without Trial by a Jury

SPECIAL DISPATCH TO THE GLOBE-DEMOCRAT.

LITTLE ROCK, ARK., January 30.—
The supreme court today decided an interesting point in the liquor laws of the state in the case of Kirkland versus State, from Jackson county. Certain liquors and fixtures belonging to Kirkland & Co. were seized in a store in Newport. Newport is what is technically termed a "dry town," and the seizure of the liquors, etc., was made by the sheriff under a warrant charging that the liquors were kept for sale in a prohibited district contrary to law.

The circuit court, on the hearing of the matter, ordered the sheriff to publicly destroy the articles seized, and the owners appealed to the supreme court. They contend that, under a clause of the statute under which the warrant was issued, providing that the person claiming such liquors, etc., so seized should have a day in court before their destruction should be ordered, they were entitled not only to a hearing upon the qu stion of their intent in keeping the liquor and other questions of fact arising in the case, but to a jury trial thereon.

The court drew a very clear distinction between the meaning of the clause giving the parties a day in court and the constitutional guaranty of trial by jury, holding that in the abatement of public nuisances the legislature may dispense with the trial by jury and still not be denying the parties the "due process of law" guaranteed by the constitution.

Another interesting question raised by counsel for the applicants was that the proceeding, being criminal in its nature the evidence of the unlawful intent must be such as to convince beyond all reasonable doubt. The court held, however, that the proceeding was one in rem, not involving the possibility of fine or imprisonment to the violators of the law, and hence not criminal.
