DEATH OF MISS ROENA PRATT.—R. H. Pratt received by telegraph the sad and unexpected news of the death of his sister, Miss Rowena Pratt, at Berkeley, California, at the age of 26. She was a trained nurse and contracted diphtheria in the discharge of her duty. She left to mourn her in this city her mother, Mrs. A. H. Pratt, four brothers, five sisters and her grandmother. Miss Pratt was beloved and esteemed by a host of friends in this vicinity, having been a student in Pacific University at Forest Grove, a member of the First Congregational church in this city and for about four years a nurse in Dr. H. W. Coe's Nervous Sanitarium. She was laid to rest in the beautiful Mountain View cemetery of Oakland, California, it being impossible to bring her here for interment because of the contagious nature of the disease from which she died.
