The U. S. Official Postal Guide for July contains the following order from the Postmaster General: "No mailable matter may be handled by rural carriers while serving their routes, unless the proper postage has been prepaid. Articles or packages, which are mailable, which are handed to the carriers, must pay postage same as any other mail matter."

As four pounds is the limit of weight allowed for one article to be transmitted by mail this order virtually precludes the carrier from accepting any article weighing less than four pounds, unless postage is prepaid; but permits him to carry heavier articles.
