At a meeting of the Stream and Forest, P.od and Gun Club of Forest Grove, Oregon, held at the office of the president on January 10, 1905, the following resolutions were unanimously passed:

1.-We oppose to hunting deer with dogs and favor limiting the number to be killed in any one season to three.

2.-We favor the hunting of Chinese pheasants with dogs and limit the number any one person may kill in one day to five birds.

3 .- We believe that twenty ducks per day for each hunter should be the limit established by law.

4.-We are strongly in favor of prohibiting the sale of any game whatever at any time of the year.

5.-We favor a hunter license of One Dollar for each person. 6.-We are utterly opposed to the
