This is a characteristic of the expedient resorted to by the natives to avoid reptiles and foes of similiar kinds. The city of pole-houses will be occupied by the Moros, who with the Igorottes stand lowest in the scale of civilization.

> Boiled dog will represent the principal sustenance of the Igorottes, who are conceded to be epicureans regarding this delicacy. The general supposition is that a hearty meal of boiled, fried or roasted canine adds fervor to the fighting powers of Igorotte warriors. Accordingly, the dogflesh is served only to the males, the fairer sex being denied this rare treat.
