The Saloon Boxes of Portland

How our hearts rejoice over every victory won for civic righteousness.

After more than a year's waiting, the ordinance has been passed, by the city council of Portland, looking toward the closing of boxes in saloon-restaurants, goes into effect.

There has been the usual delay in putting the measure into operation through an appeal to the supreme court on the part of the saloon keepers but Mayor Lane seems determined to carry out the wishes of the better class of our people. The movement was started at a Women's Prayermeeting in the parlors of the First Presbyterian church, where the awful crimes committed against young girls was discussed. A committee was appointed and the co-operation of the Ministerial Association was invoked and secured, they in turn securing the assistance of the Municipal League. The ordinance was framed and submitted to the council by one of its members when the bill was referred to a committee.

The day the committee was to act upon the measure the council chamber was filled by men and women until there was scarcely standing room. The W. C. T. U. was well represented, there were ministers of the churches, members of their flock, business men and women who were not members of any church, all giving silent support to the ordinance, by their presence. The plea for the measure was made by Mr. Cotton, a prominent attorney and business man of the city. Mr. Cotton made a very earnest plea for the better protection of the young and unwary coming to Portland and in closing appealed to the civic pride of the members of the committee, which would be shown by giving the measure their support. It is needless to say, the committee made a favorable report and the ordinance was passed by the council.

As the ordinance is to be enforced, that shame, the boxes connected with the saloon, will be removed from the city of Portland.
