secure the protection of all persons and property therein, and to provide for the health, cleanliness, ornament, peace and good order of the city.

11th. To prevent and remove nuisances, and to declare by ordinance what shall constitute the same, and to make the expense of abating such nuisance a lien upon the property where such exists.

12th. To make provisions for lighting the streets and providing the city with light, for supplying the city with good and wholesome water and the erection of such works, within said city as may be necessary or convenient for supplying such water and light, and to grant to any corporation or private person, with such conditions and regulations as the Common Council may prescribe, a franchise for not more than twenty years, permission to erect and construct such works within the city, and with all the rights and powers appurtenant thereto, including the right to use streets and public highways for the purpose of laying pipes and wires, and erecting poles and wires for conveying electricity, etc.

13th. To locate and construct any ditch, canal or pipe for water, and any drain, sewer or culvert which it may deem necessary or convenient, and for such purpose it shall have the right to enter upon any land between the termini of such ditch, canal, pipe or drain, sewer or culvert for the purpose of examining, locating or surveying the line of such ditch, canal, pipe, drain sewer or culvert, doing no unnecessary damage thereby, and to appropriate such of said land as may be necessary for the construction of said ditch, canal, pipe, drain, sewer or culvert, in like manner provided by the laws of the state for the appropriation of land or the right of way of corporations, and to appropriate or divert from its natural course or channel, for the purpose of draining or flushing and drain, sewer or culvert, any spring or stream of water.

14th. To provide for the punishment, restraint and employment of vagrants; to provide a city prison and a house of correction for the reception of vagrants and vicious persons, and to prescribe rules and regulations for the government of the same, and to compel all persons who may be imprisoned within the city prison for vagrancy, or for violation of any city ordinance to work on the public streets under the control of such city officers as the council shall designate, and to provide for the punishment of any persons who shall refuse to work when ordered to do so.

15th. To provide for the prevention and extinguishment of fires and for the preservation of property endangered thereby and to provide for the appointment and duties of officers required for such purpose.

16th. To license, tax, regulate and prohibit any and all domestic animals, including dogs and fowls from running at large within the city, or any specific part thereof, and to provide for the taking up and impounding of such animals and their sale or destruction if not redeemed; to regulate, license and tax the keeping of stallions, and all other animals kept or allowed to stand for breeding purposes; to regulate, restrain or prohibit the driving of bands of horses, cattle or sheep, through the streets of the city.

17th. To provide for a police force.

18th. To regulate the location and management of market places and slaughter yards.

19th. To regulate the sale and storage of gunpowder and other combustible or dangerous materials; and to regulate or prohibit the use of guns, pistols and firearms, firecrackers, bombs, and detonating works of all descriptions; and to prohibit the carrying of dangerous weapons in a concealed manner within the limits of the city.

20th. To restrain and punish intoxicating, fighting and quarreling on the streets, and any disturbance in any public place, or indecent practice, and to define what shall constitute the same.

21st. To establish and regulate the fees and compensation of all officers of this municipal corporation.

22nd. To provide for the punishment for the violation of any ordinance of the city by a fine or imprisonment, not exceeding one hundred (\$100) dollars' fine or twenty (20) days' imprisonment, or both, or a forfeiture or penalty not exceeding two hundred (\$200) dollars for each offence.

23rd. To prevent and prohibit the sale, circulation and disposition of obscene literature, including books, papers, prints, pictures and the like, and to punish any person who sells, or offers for sale, or who circulates or disposes of any such literature, and to define and declare from time to time what, if any, books, papers, prints, pictures and the like are obscene within the purpose and province of this provision.

24th. To prohibit the exhibition of defamed and crippled persons, and to prohibit such persons from begging upon the streets or public places.

25th. To regulate the rate of speed upon all rail roads within the corporate limits, and to prevent fast and furious riding and driving upon the streets and alleys therein; to regulate and prohibit the running or driving of any bicycle, tricycle or similar wheeled vehicle or any steam, traction or portable engine or reaper or other harvesting machinery, through the streets of the city, or any specified part thereof; to repress all unnecessary blowing of whistles of locomotives and engines at machine shops and factories, and elsewhere, and to define what shall constitute the same, and to provide for the punishment by fine or imprisonment, or both, of any person or persons doing or causing the same to be done.

26th. To prevent and prohibit the erection or repair of wooden buildings within the limits to be ascertained and defined by the council, and to restrict and limit the height of buildings within such limits; to provide for and determine the number and size of places of entrance to and exit from all public halls, churches and other buildings used for public gatherings, and the mode of hanging doors thereat; and to provide for the naming and numbering of the streets and numbering of houses; to permit, allow and regulate the laying down of tracks for street cars and other railroads upon such streets as the council may designate; to regulate and prohibit the hanging of banners and placards and signs in or across the streets, or from houses or buildings to provide for the cleaning and sprinkling of streets, and to prohibit persons from ransacking the streets at unreasonable hours.

27th. To provide for the collection of delinquent taxes.

28th. To purchase take and hold real property when sold for a delinquent tax or assessment levied or imposed under the authority of the city of Forest Grove, and to sell and dispose of the same.

29th. To provide for the survey of the blocks and streets of the city, and for making and establishing the boundary lines of such blocks and streets, provided it shall have no power to locate any street upon or to any way interfere with the lands now enclosed and used as the site of Tualatin Academy and Pacific University, so long as such lands continue to be used for such purpose.

30th. To employ a surveyor and provide for his compensation.

31st. To provide for the printing and publishing of the Charter and Ordinances of the city or any other matter that the common council may deem necessary or expedient to have published.

32nd. The common council may, in the manner prescribed in the following section, provide for the issuance of bonds by the city in any amount not to exceed thirty thousand dollars.

33rd. When ever the city of Forest Grove shall contemplate the issuance of bonds for any improvement authorized by this act, the Council shall by ordinance direct the manner in which the estimate of the cost of such improvement shall be made, and such estimate shall be filed with the recorder, and before any indebtedness shall be incurred the council shall cause the same to be submitted to the tax payers of the city at a special election called by the council for that purpose, to be held after the same notice and in the same manner as the city election and each person, who shall vote for or against incurring such indebtedness, above mentioned, shall have written or printed upon his ticket, if vot-
