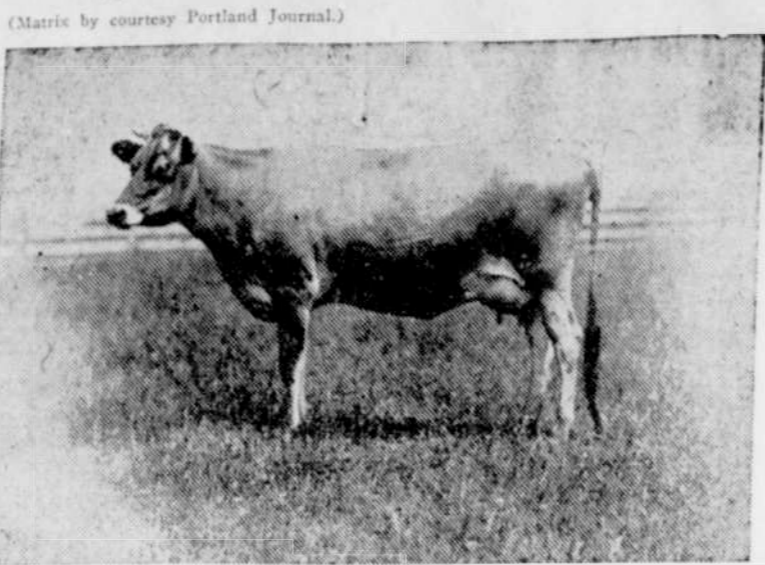

Olga, World's Record Jersey.



Two-Year-Old Producer of 7,738 Pounds of Milk in 365 Days.

The work of Golden Chief's Olga adds another record-breaker to the Hazel Fern herd of Jerseys, property of the W. S. Ladd estate, in its dairy test. This heifer has the distinction of holding the world's record for a Jersey of her age. The secretary of the American Jersey Cattle Club, in accepting the test, writes that "the yield of Golden Chief's Olga is the largest yet recorded of a cow under 2 years in authenticated test."
The test covered a full year, and results are shown by the month in the following table:

Average per cent of fat, 5.4104. Estimated butter on basis of 85 per cent fat, 492 pounds, 34 ounces. Her age at beginning of test was 1 year 10 months; estimated weight, 850 pounds. Scored 95 points by Dr. Withycombe, director of the Oregon experiment station. She was fed during the year: Bran, 539 pounds; ground oats and peas, 527 pounds; hay, 1,827 pounds; roots, 984 pounds; pasture, 5 months. Three of the champions in the herd are: Fern's Surprise, Champion yearly authenticated test, aged Jersey cow, 14,452 pounds milk, testing 769 pounds butter. Merry Miss—Champion yearly authenticated test, Jersey heifer, 11,152 pounds milk, testing 691 pounds butter. Golden Chief's Olga—Champion yearly authenticated test, heifer under 2 years, 7,738.8 pounds milk, testing 492 pounds 9 ounces butter.
