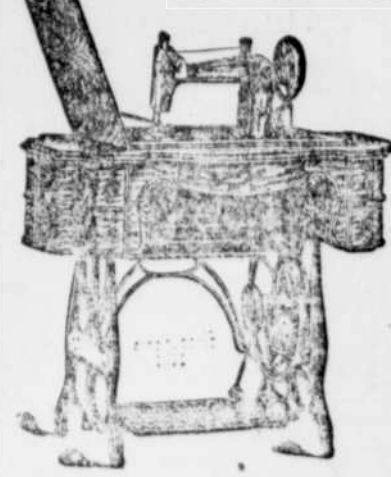

No Remedy for "Bazaar Fever."

A meeting of most of the town's physicians, together with the board of health, was held last night at Vert's Hall to discuss the ways and means of stamping out the "Bazaar Fever," known to the medical world as Bazaarium Santa Clausum, and also to hear the doctors' report, as to their success in discovering remedies for the malady. The mayor and most of the city council were in attendance, and from the stern look on the mayor's face it was apparent that he was anything but pleased with the doctors' failure in checking the fever. The meeting was opened with that favorite song: "Where is my Wandering Boy Tonight?" And when everybody at the meeting joined in the beautiful chorus: "Down at the Toy Bazaar," there were tears in many eyes.

The doctors' report was next in order, and from their downcast look and pale faces, it was evident that their battles with "Bazaarium Santa Clausum" had been a failure. One of them, who was the discoverer of the cause of the fever said, "It has always been my custom to treat the cause of the disease more than the malady or in other words to 'fight the enemy with his own weapons,' and as you know the trouble is caused by the children Laving "Christmas trees in their heads." I suggested that a good strong twig of a Christmas tree be applied generously to their backs for at least 15 minutes." It seemed to help temporarily, but did not last long and when all the members of the house took the fever too, there was nobody to apply the twig. The other doctors said they had tried all the remedies they knew of but without any lasting effect, and said that the fever had spread so rapidly that everybody, young and old, had it now. They suggested to let it have its way, as it was not very disastrous only perhaps to papa's pocket book and a case of Bazaarium Santa Clausum never was known after the holidays were over.

After a very heated discussion it was voted to follow this advice, but to instruct the fire department to be on the alert all the time, as most of the town is almost deserted in the afternoon, everybody being down at The Bazaar buying Christmas goods, and whole blocks may burn up before you could get people away from there.
