P. U. SECOND TEAM VICTORS.

Scores 56 to 0 Against Hillsboro High—Largest Game Ever Recorded on Home Gridiron.

Saturday, Dec. 7 the Pacific second team played the last game of the season with a team from Hillsboro composed of high school and town players. The game was arranged on short notice and the P. U. boys went onto the field for the first time in two weeks. On the other hand several of the Hillsboro players did not know they were to play until a short time before the game.

From the kickoff it was evident that the Varsity had the advantage. Hillsboro made yardage but once although her back field was heavy. The P. U. team played like clock work and the

brilliant points of the game brought smiles to the faces of those in the grandstand, especially the members of the first team.

Perhaps they remembered a previous score of 52 to 0. At the beginning of the 1st half Holmen Ferrin got the ball and went around end for a quarterback run of 30 yards and a touch down. After this it was a series of repetitions. To say that the visitors were taken off their feet would be putting it mildly. Time and again the rosters cheered for the "law student" as he tore around end; or for H. Ferrin as he seat the team down the field for "one more touch down."

The first half ended with the score 22-0. The grandstand clamored for "99" and Pacific's boys worked like Trojans to make good.

In the second half H. Ferrin, Alec Robinson, Thorngy Holmes, A. C. Allen and G. Brown distinguished themselves time and again. The "law student" seemed to be a "hoodoo" for Hillsboro. Time and again they tried in vain to down him. The visitors put up a plucky game but were outclassed. The half ended with the score 56-0.
