The Times and Portland Journal last week took exception to The News' version of the state treasurer's bond item as being a play in politics on the part of Gov. Chamberlain. This is to be expected of democratic papers, but they should likewise be fair and published the whole of the item. Nevertheless it doesn't alter the case either in whole or in part. All the state now holds as security for the amount on Steel's bond which was forfeited, is the bonding company's note. Supposing the bonding company should become insolvent before the note becomes due, where then will the state get off at? The News simply suggested that the state would have been safer had the governor held both the Title Guarantee and Trust Co. and the bonding company for the amount of the state's money deposited in that bank, and required the treasurer to give additional bonds to cover the difference between the amount deposited and approximately what the defunct bank would pay. But that wouldn't serve the governor's purpose. But later along comes W. M. Ladd and guarantees the bank will pay out in full which would have made the state's money just as safe as it was before. But no, the governor was too anxious to pluck another plum. The treasurer should forfeit his bond and be required to furnish a personal bond of a much larger sum, and in a very short time at that, so if he failed the governor could declare the office vacant and appoint a democrat. This may be "idiotic" on the part of The News, but it is surely an idiotic play in politics on the part of the governor in which he miserably failed.
