The improvements include a concrete basement and heating apparatus, an addition to the north side of the church, with a modern steeple. Entrances are planned to the building from the north and east. The interior will be fitted in an up to date manner. The cost of the whole improvement will be about \$3,000.—Hillsboro Argus.
