It now develops that Senator Fulton did not attack the President and his policies at the Ankeny dinner given in Washington last Saturday as reported in the Sunday papers.

George Hancock of the firm of Hancock & Gordon, liverymen of this city, has announced his candidacy for the office of sheriff. Mr. Hancock is the first man in this city to ask for an office in the present campaign, and should he be elected he will give the county one of the best sheriffs the county ever had.

W. S. U'Ren of Oregon City has announced his candidacy for the U. S. Senatorship. He openly charges Fulton as a corruptionist and as adherent to the Standard Oil company, besides he takes a whack at H. M. Cake who is also a candidate for the place. U'Ren is the father of Statement No. 1, and upon this he expects to win the race.

Some time ago The News published an item concerning the establishment of a cannery at this place and it now seems that the time is ripe for the establishment of such a plant here. The recent meeting of the fruit growers gives evidence that the fruit necessary for a cannery can be raised in this county and we believe such an undertaking would be profitable.

Senator Fulton has most emphatically denied all the charges made against him by Francis J. Heney in his recent speech in the Congregational church of Portland. Fulton claims that Heney's charges are made through revenge and he materially substantiates the fact by the publication of certain correspondence which clearly vindicates him from all the accusations made by the prosecutor. On the face of it, it is very evident that Heney is not making the attacks from a purely official standpoint, but in the hope of dictating the politics of Oregon. Heney is an energetic prosecutor and leaves no stone unturned to fasten guilt upon his victims, either by promising them immunity or otherwise; and it seems the same tactics are to be turned upon Oregon politics. He has a fat job with the government; gets his own price; lives where he pleases and does as he pleases—he's the government's spoiled kid, and we suppose Oregon will have to put up with it.

Proposals Wanted for Crushing and Hauling Rock.

Sealed bids will be received by the County Court of Washington County, Oregon, until 2 o'clock P. M. on the 14th day of March, 1908, and then opened, for the crushing of 5500 cubic yards of rock, 2000 yards at the Thatcher quarry four miles north of Forest Grove, 2000 yards at the Spring Hill quarry four miles south of Forest Grove and 1500 yards at the Cedar Mill quarry three miles north of Beaverton on the Cornell road.

The county will furnish the crusher now at the Thatcher quarry. The Contractor will be required to move and set up the machinery at the different quarries.

Bidders will be required to name a price per cubic yard delivered in the bins, the two finer grades to comprise at least 45 per cent of the product, also a price for the excess needed over the 45 per cent of the two finer grades. Bids will also be received at the same time for the hauling of said rock, bids to state the price per cubic yard per mile.

Bids may be made on the crushing and hauling together or on any part of the hauling. The court reserves the right to increase the above amounts of rock to be crushed 50 per cent at each of the quarries, also the right to reject any or all bids.
