President Bryan's appointment is the beginning of the organization of the Berkshire association in the state of Washington. This association reaches through nearly all the states o' the union, and in the opinion of President Bryan, its coming into the state of Washington marks an important step in the livestock industry of the Northwest. Discussing the matter President Bryan said:

'I believe the Berkshire association is one of the most active and successful States, and that its work in the Northwest cannot fail to produce good results. The Berkshire is favored by many of the most prominent stockraisers in America, among whom I might mention Nick Gentry, of Sedalia. Missouri, who is the greatest breeder of Berkshire hogs in the country; Reuten Gentry, of Kentucky; Mr. Hocd, of 'Hood's Sarsaparilla' fame; and George Vanderbilt, of Asheville, Tennessee. Among the most prominent breeders of Berkshires in the Northwest are the Ladd estate, of Portland, and Mr. Paul Clagstone, of Spokane. 




