The engineering crew had just returned from a trip in the mountains, E. S. Miller being the engineer in charge. The doctor found that while five of the men had the disease, it was of a very mild type, and all were convalescing. While the invalids are isolated from the rest of the camp, it is likely other cases will appear, as all

were exposed before the nature of the disease was known. A strict quarantine has been established, but the camp will suffer no hardship, as they are plentifully supplied with provisions and the convalescents will be able to nurse any new cases.—Hillsboro Independent.
