The old charter has been one of draw backs for a greater Forest Grove, and now that the new electric line is entering the city, the needs of a wider scope in municipal affairs are more apparent than ever. We need a new water system, better electric lights, better sidewalks, more good streets—in fact we need everything. A new charter opens the way to get it.
