Liability of Members of the Mutuals in Oregon.

Letter from the State Insurance Commissioner:

State of Oregon.
Office of the Secretary of State, Salem,
July 3, 1908.
Mr. E. H. Bacon, The Coast Review,
San Francisco, Cal.

Dear Sir:—
I wish to own receipt of yours of June 26th, requesting to be informed whether there is any law in this state limiting the liability of members of mutual fire insurance companies or associations, and in response have to advise, that from a careful examination of the act regulating mutual fire insurance, I am unable to find any provision thereof which in any manner limits the liability of members to one additional assessment or any number of assessments, though I am of the opinion that an association can, by its constitution and by-laws, limit the liability of the members thereof.

The Bankers & Merchants Mutual Fire Relief Association, by Section 20

of its by laws, has limited the contingent liability of its members as follows: "The liability of each holder of a certificate in this association shall be limited to one full premium hereon. The basis of rates adopted by this association is that of the Board of Fire Underwriters of the Pacific on January 1, 1907, or such additions or deductions therefrom as the increased or decreased hazard may require."

Following are the proceedings of the county commissioners for September: Viewer's report on petition of Ole Olson et al, continued until Oct. 8, '08, at 2 o'clock p. m.

John Vanderval is authorized to write an insurance policy on the court house in the sum of \$5,000.

A warrant was ordered drawn in favor of J S Loring for \$1014.50 for balance due on Minter bridge.

The resignation of C. E. Meacham as road supervisor was accepted.

On petition of O. & C. R. R. Co. for refund of tax was allowed in the sum of \$44.83.

On petition of C. J. Scoffins for refund of tax was allowed in the sum of \$1.92.

It is ordered that the tax sale certificates sold to Bagley & Hare and others on May 27, '08, be assigned to the purchasers of the same.

The petition of John Stewart for refund of tax was ordered that \$20.85 be refunded on account of error in certificate.

The petition of Ole Olson et al for road, it was ordered established according to petitions, said petitioners to pay \$100 damages and county court to pay the balance.

The following bids for the county Poor Farm were opened:

Clarence Young to pay county for rent of farm, \$250 per year; for care of inmates, \$12 per month per capita. Martin Vandehy, to pay county for rent of farm, \$150 per year; for care of inmates \$10 per month per capita. Chas. Bradley to pay county for rent of farm \$250 per year; for care of inmates \$11 per month per capita. It was ordered that the bid of Martin Vandehy be accepted.

Petition of Thos. Tucker for refund of tax was granted in the sum of 40 cents.

The bid of D. B. Reasoner for bridges in Centerville and Base Line bridge repairs awarded. Centerville bridge \$224 and repairs \$75.
