## Died.

Mrs. Belle Finecount Haines of Buxton, died in that place last Thursday afternoon at 4 p. m. Deceased was born in New York state on July 15, 1851. She was married to Herbert Finecount, who died in 1878. She was again married to Elwood J. Haines in Tacoma, July 2, 1903. Her father died in Forest Grove, August 29, this year. After the death of her father she moved to Buxton. The remains were brought to the undertaking establishment of V. H. Limber and the funeral was held in the chapel last Saturday at 11 a. m., with interment in Forest View cemetery.

Charles H. Olmstead died Saturday, October 10, at 5:30 p. m. on the west bound train near Rawlins, Wyoming. The deceased came west to Palouse county, Wash., about eighteen years ago and a few months after coming to Washington he engaged in the general merchandise business in Pullman, where he remained until 1905 when he came to Portland. The body was brought here Tuesday and funeral services held in the home Wednesday, October 21, at 1 p. m. under the auspices of the lodge. Mr. Olmstead leaves a wife and three children.
