Mrs. Buxton is the proud possessor of a Hobert M. Cable piano.

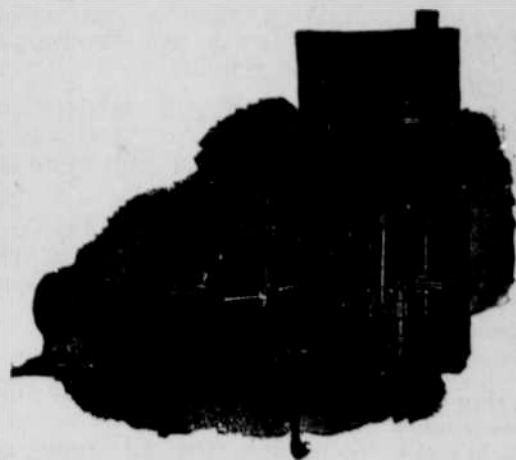
Mrs. Kennedy and Mrs. Harris attended a Sunday school convention last week.
