

Ordinance No. 182.

ions for water shall fully set orth the uses for which it is re- quired, thereby indicating about he desired quantity, the lot or lock on which it is to be used and if in a building the class of uilding; no person shall be en- titled to use city water directly r indirectly for any other pur- poses than those stated in his or er application, nor shall any con- sumer be allowed to supply water directly or indirectly to any other person for any purpose without permission from the Common Council. If the Com- mon Council shall approve of any application, it shall place service pipes from the most accessible main to the curb or outside of sidewalk at the point most con- venient for service, and shall sup- ply such service pipes with stop- cocks or gates and the city shall be the sole owner and shall have control of all such pipes and stop- cocks, provided, no service pipe shall be laid unless the applicant shall have advanced a sufficient sum of money to reimburse the city for its expense as above pro- vided, which money so advanced shall be credited on the appli- cant's water rate and provided, further, all consumers shall at their own expense connect with such stop-cock or cut-off at the curb with standard galvanized service pipe, which pipe for resi- dence shall not exceed three quarters of an inch diameter, and such service pipe shall be placed not less than twenty in- ches under ground and shall be kept in good repair, and provided further, no consumer, plumber or other person shall be allowed to connect or attach or reconnect any pipe to the City mains or service pipes or make any altera- tion in any pipe or pipes so con- nected without authority from the Common Council or its author- ized agent and provided further, all buildings in which city water is used shall be held subject to reasonable inspection, and pro- vided further, in case of accident, or for the purpose of making re- pairs or extentions, to the system, water may be cut off without notice to the consumers, and the City shall not be liable for dam- ages on account of the water so cut off. Water must not be al- lowed to run to waste to prevent freezing, nor kept running at any time longer than necessary for its intended use.

SECTION V - 4

Water Rates

The rates to be charged for water per month shall be as fol- lows:
1st. In dwellings, one faucet, \$1.00; each additional faucet, 25¢; provided; that the total rate for any dwelling shall not exceed \$1.50; provided further, that all faucets in dwellings whether served directly or indirectly with City water shall be counted.
2nd. For hotels, one faucet, \$2, each additional faucet, 25¢;

provided, the total rate for any hotel shall not exceed \$4.00.

- 3rd. For private stables, 50¢.
- 4th. For livery stables, \$4.00.
- 5th. For barber shops with bath tubs, \$1.50.
- 6th. For each laundry, \$2.
- 7th. For photograph galleries, \$2.00.
- 8th. For stores, offices and shops, 50¢.
- 9th. For lawn-sprinkling, 2, 500 square feet or less, 50¢, for each additional 1,000 square feet or fraction thereof, 20¢.
- 10th. For garden sprinkling or watering, for each 500 square feet or less of surface sprinkled or watered, 25¢, for each addi- tional 100 square feet or fraction thereof, 5¢.

11th. For street sprinkling in residence portion of city, for each 75 feet front, or less, 50¢, for each additional 50 feet front 25¢; in business portion of city for each 25 feet front or less, \$1; for each additional 25 feet front, 25¢; pro- vided, water for lawn, garden and street sprinkling shall be used only between the hours of six o'clock a. m. to eight o'clock a. m. and from six o'clock p. m. to nine o'clock p. m. Except in cases where water is used through meter, in which cases water can be used at any time during the day, between the hours of five o'clock a. m. and nine o'clock p. m.

For parties using water through a meter, for any purpose whatever the rate shall be at a minimum price of \$1 per month for 3000 gallons or less and for each additional 1000 gallons or fraction thereof, 10¢ per 1000 gallons. When consumer uses water for street, lawn or garden only, without having a meter, the rate shall be \$1.00 per month for 2500 square feet or fraction thereof, and 25¢ for each 1000 square feet or fraction thereof, and the full amount for four months June, July, August and September shall be paid in ad- vance.

Parties living outside the city limits may be furnished with water by first entering into a written contract with the city, which contract shall provide that the water must be furnished through a meter, said meter shall be provided by the consumer and the rate shall be at a minimum price of \$1.50 per month for 3, 000 gallons or less, and for each 1,000 gallons above 3,000, 20¢ per 1,000 or fraction thereof.

SECTION VI - 4

Penalty on Non-Payment of Rates

At any time when a consumer does not pay the sum due the city for water for ten days after the same is due the Commissioner shall so inform the Chief of Pol- ice and he shall cut off all ser- vice from such patron, and such service shall not be renewed un- til such person shall have paid the amount due the city for ser- vice together with the sum of 50¢ for cutting out and 50¢ for re- connection with the City System.

SECTION VII - 4

A violation of any of the pro- visions of this Ordinance shall subject such person to a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$25 or imprisonment in the City jail for a term of from 1 to 30 days, or both, and the City may discontinue water service to such person at the option of the City Council.
