TRY POND LILY SALAD

MADE WITH LETTUCE, BOILED EGGS AND OTHER THINGS. Veal Croquettes That Are Tasty, Made From Meat Left Over—Stuffed Peppers, Madge's Cookies and Pie Crusts.

Pond Lily Salad.—On separate salad plates arrange some nice white lettuce leaves. Boil eggs hard, one and one-half for each person. Cut whites in long strips, placing these in center of lettuce. Then chop yolks fine, adding finely chopped celery, parsley and olives. Mix well with mayonnaise dressing, season with salt and pepper and place in middle of dish.

Stuffed Peppers.—Be sure and get bell peppers. For six large peppers cut tops and take out seeds. Boil for half an hour and one-half cups of chopped veal, one-half cup cold boiled rice, three chopped tomatoes, one-half teaspoon salt, one tablespoon of melted butter. Fill the shells with this and a few buttered cracker crumbs on top. Bake about one hour.

Good Pie Crust.—Six heaping table spoons of flour; about half teaspoon of baking powder, tablespoon lard and a little salt. Mix with milk instead of water.

In the KITCHEN

Kerosene will make boots or shoes hardened by water soft and pliable as new.

Boiled starch is made smooth and effective by the introduction of sperm, salt or gum arabic dissolved.

It's a good scheme to keep a long crochet needle in the bathroom to draw out threads or hairs from the waste pipes, which stop the outflow of water.

Steel, when rusty, may be cleaned by giving the article a good coating of sweet oil, leaving it for a few days and then rubbing it with unslaked lime.

Parsley may be kept fresh and green for several days if it is put in a covered earthen jar in a cool place. It will last longer than in water.

To clean and renew shine of leather chairs, brush off first all dust. Then rub well with a mixture of three parts benzine and one of sweet oil.

Rice Ice Cream. Boil for five minutes two cupfuls of cream, four tablespoonfuls of sugar, the rind of one lemon, three bay leaves and one inch of cinnamon stick.

APPLE BUSINESS GROWS.

Northwest Will Soon Market 100,000 Carloads Per Year. Spokane, Wash.—"It is no idle statement to say that in a comparatively few years there will be 100,000 carloads of apples marketed from Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana alone."

This statement is contained in a letter received by the management of the National Apple show from Howard Elliott, president of the Northern Pacific Railway company, forwarding a subscription of \$1,000 for the railroad and \$250 as a personal contribution to the fourth annual competitive exposition and Enakops street carnival, November 23 to 30.

"Therefore, it will be necessary for the apple grower to do what the grain grower has done. This means that as the production increases the grower must have facilities at his home orchard, at the nearby station and throughout the country to properly care for his crop to receive the best market prices."

LIVE STOCK WORTH \$91,629,400

Dr. Withycombe of O. A. C. Tells Interesting Facts at Banquet.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis—That the annual live stock production of the state is worth \$91,689,400, was stated by Dr. James Withycombe, director of the experiment stations at the State Agricultural College, in an address at the annual banquet of the Oregon Pure Bred Live Stock association at the State fair.

C. L. Hawley of the college board of regents was reelected president at the annual meeting, and H. C. Marris was made secretary. The meeting was addressed by Prof. Carlisle of Idaho, Prof. Van Pelt of Iowa, and President W. J. Kerr of O. A. C.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis—Royal High Clerk, last year's champion Berkshire boar at the state fair, which also won a second this year at Salem, has just been bought by the Oregon Agricultural college from Barrows & Davenport, of Crabtree, Ore., for the purpose of starting a new Berkshire herd on the college farm.

Eight small pigs were also purchased by the college for use on the demonstration train which is to go up through Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow counties, through the dry farming section, in October.
