## Real Poverty in Japan

In a recent number of the Japan Advertiser in a translation
from an article in the Shin Nihon from an article in the Shanese newspaper, by Nagai a Jyutaro, about farm conditions in Ryutaro, about farm conditions
Japan which serve to give the Japan which serve of the United States some adeguate idea of conditions as they actually are in Japan.
The writer points out that but $14 \%$ of the landed area of Japan is susceptible of cultivation, the total in acres being but 14,010 ,000 . Yet this limited area is occupied by $4,927,777$ separate land owners. Of these, $2,299,714 \mathrm{cul}$ tivate farms of less than an acre nd a quarter each. $72 \%$ of the entire agricultural population
on farms of less than 2.50 acres on farms of less than the whole empire but 2,705 farmers each cultivating an area of 125 acres or more.
The degree of their poverty may be judged by the fact that there are 432,759 land owning their taxes this year in an average amount of $\$ 1.20$ each which they are unable to pay. Last year there were 50,547 land owning farmers unable to pay government taxes amounting to an average of 77 cents each, whose
effects were seized and publicly sold to pay this petty tax, which it was beyond their power to meet.
