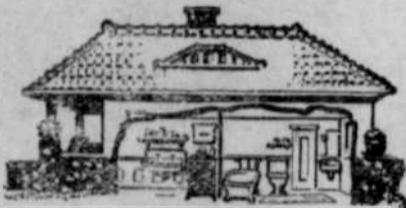

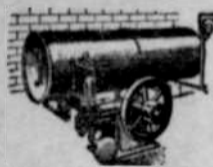

OSWALD OLSEN IS IN GERMANY

The following is taken from the Oregonian and will no doubt be of interest to our citizens:

"Music lovers in Portland and throughout Oregon will be pleased to learn of the advancement which Oswald Olsen, of Cornelius, is making in Dresden, under the direction of Leo Charles Sparks and Franz H. Armbruster. During the summer of 1909, while Mr. Sparks was spending his vacation in this city Mr. Olsen asked to have his voice tested. In the midst of the vocal examination Mr. Sparks arose from his piano and said, 'I must have that voice, you must return with me to Germany for training. Since the time of their arrival in Dresden, Mr. Olsen has been the constant companion of his instructors, living in the same building and receiving a daily lesson under their painstaking direction. He also studies the piano and three modern languages, German, French and Italian, having special instructors in each of these.

"Mr. Olsen's voice is stated to be a basso profundo of phenomenal depth and richness, and although he is but 20 years old his voice ranks in its range among the lowest of known voices, musically speaking. In a letter to Oregon, Mr. Olsen's instructor in Berlin says: 'I have but the best things to write you. Mr. Olsen is a splendid student and has made tremendous progress in this last year. I feel that some day he will be a noted singer. I am personally attached to him and shall do all in my power to bring him to the front. He is my daily companion and I like to have him with me. You would have been very proud of him had you heard him at my closing recital last June. He showed the greatest progress of all my pupils—a class of 60. I am anxious that Mr. Olsen should not sing in public too early, for bass voices are always harder to cultivate than others, and I want him to come out as a magnificent artist. I shall do all in my power to further his progress. I write this to tell you how Mr. Olsen is doing, and how perfectly satisfied I am with him.'

"Mr. Olsen expects to return to America in July, 1912, for a summer's vacation. He will then have spent three years abroad surrounded by opportunities rarely enjoyed by any student. Those acquainted with him are awaiting his return with great expectancy, hoping to hear him in concert and recital."
