AN INTERESTING LETTER FROM AFAR

(Continued from last week)

Teamsters use bullock carts here. The bullocks have a pronounced hump at the back of the neck. The carts are two-wheeled. The load and the yoke are so adjusted that the weight comes on top of the neck in front of the hump. A callous is formed here. Loads of good size are moved, but the animals look strong and healthy. Native houses are thatched with palm leaves. Overcoats to shed the rain are made of the same material. All drinking water has to be filtered.

The English governor resident here is a Presbyterian. He is a staunch friend of our mission work. In more than one case he has conferred with Bishop Oldham on government matters and has taken his advice.

Wednesday, Sept. 21, 1910.

We left Singapore at about 6:30 this morning. On the hills to our right were large fields of pineapples. We passed frowning fortifications at the entrance to the harbor. For the first time we saw what is called a glassy sea. The sea was like a great pane of plate glass. The shining of the sun on it made an attractive sight. A shark was kind enough to show himself to us today. Many small islands covered with cocoanuts groves, bananas, palms and other tropical vegetation made a prolonged picture. All day we have been in sight of land—Johore, I suppose where the sultan hunts elephants and tigers. Have a new passenger for Lucknow—going to the Women's College.

Thursday, Sept. 22, 1910.

Tonight we expect to reach Penang—our last stop before Calcutta. Two young English military officers who are returning to their station at Cawnpore, India, after spending a two months' leave of absence in Java are on board. They are full of interesting experiences. When the soldiers in India are on duty all caste and religious rules in regard to clothing, eating and drinking are abandoned. If this were not true it would be impossible to carry on warfare in the ordinary way.

We have seen several sharks, some gorgeous clouds, a brilliant rainbow, exquisite coloring on the ocean, and the city of Malacca since writing p. 94.

Friday, Sept. 23, 1910.

We anchored last night about midnight in the harbor of Penang. Missionaries came to meet Miss Jackson who leaves us here, and we came ashore early this morning to the Anglo-Chinese school. We are to leave tomorrow.

Penang is more full of tropical vegetation than any other place we have seen. It seems fit for a paradise.

This morning we heard the school children singing. "I can hear my Saviour calling." They sang well and it sounded much like home.

The man who feeds the Chinese passengers from Hongkong to either Singapore or Penang gets 60 Hongkong cents—less than 30 U. S.—with which to pay for food for one person for from six to eleven days. He is said to spend not more than one-half this amount and to keep the rest as profit. It seems impossible.

At Singapore we had our first experience in sleeping in a curtained bed. Curtains like mos-
