Teamsters use bullock carts here. The bullocks have a pronounced hump at the back of
the neck. The carts are twowheeled. The load and the yoke are so adjusted that the weight comes on top of the neck in front of the hump. A callous is formed here. Wednesday, Sept. 21, 1910 We left Singapore at about
