Pleads Guilty to Serious Charge

When the case of the State of Oregon against Alfredo Sabbatini, charged with an attack on a young girl near Beaverton, last summer, was called for trial in the Circuit Court in Hillsboro last Friday the defendant changed

his plea from not guilty to guilty. The court imposed a sentence of from one to 10 years in the penitentiary and paroled the defendant, on condition that he pay the cost of the prosecution within one year and report monthly to the court.

Plans for Rock Roads
