Civil Service Examination.

The U. S. Civil Service Commission announces an examination on August 3, 1912, for the position of forest clerk, (male) to secure eligibles to fill vacancies as they may occur at an entrance salary of \$1100 or \$1200 in the Forest Service. Applicants for this examination must have a knowledge of stenography, typewriting, and the elements of bookkeeping and have had at least one year's actual experience in clerical work in a business office. The age limits are 18 to 40 years. Considerable difficulty has been experienced in securing eligibles for these positions, and all qualified persons are urged to make application for and take the coming examination. For application blank and full information apply to the Secretary, Eleventh Civil Service District, 224 Federal Building, Seattle, Washington.
