The point which they make regarding the approaching inadequacy of the plant is not to be lightly passed over, for it is a fact that the machinery must be added to if a service is to be given equal to that offered by the applicant. Machinery and buildings cost large sums of money and the money takes time to raise. This matter should have the most careful consideration and our action should be such as to warrant permanent and profitable results. A published statement from our Council setting forth receipts and disbursements for the last 9 months might shed light on the subject.
