

#### Jury Convicts Edward Naylor.

Hillsboro, Ore.-After four

hours of deliberation, a Circuit Court jury Saturday afternoon unlawful relations with Miss Martha Traver, who has been keeping house for the defendant at Forest Grove for over two companion since Naylor was shot several months ago, by Frank Lenocker, of Yamhill. Neither men had met prior to the shooting, and after Lenocker had shot Naylor, he turned the gun on himself, and committed suicide.
