HEALTH HINT FOR TODAY.

Removing Callous.
For callous on the foot soak in hot water containing a little washing soda, after which cover the callous with ointment. This may be repeated several nights. Or you may paint the callous twice a day for several days with a solution of flexible collodion and salicylic acid, thirty grains of the latter to an ounce of the former. Do not apply this solution to the healthy skin. After this treatment the foot should be soaked in hot water and the surface scraped with a dull knife.

Hillsboro, Ore.—Hundreds of farmers in Washington County are in arms against section 41, amendment to the game laws of the state, giving anglers the right to use as a highway for angling purposes all territory between the streams and the high water lines. This would mean, in many instances, that a fisherman could walk over half of an owner's place, as the Tualatin river and Dairy creek oftentimes flood acres of territory.
