## Oregon Electric Railway Now Open to Corvallis. Limited and Local Trains

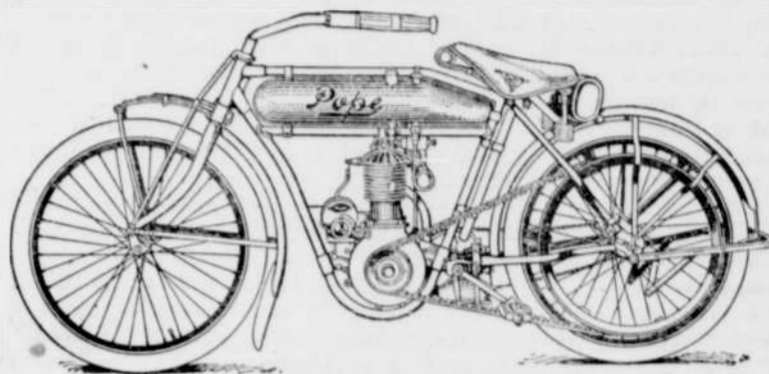


The new line to Corvallis just opened for service places all points on the Oregon Electric Railway in close transportation touch with Corvallis. Current folders give train schedules and other details.
