Artificial Incubation.

Artificial incubation is not new. It has been practiced in Egypt for centuries. A study of the methods in use there, however, is of no use to us, for long as it has been practiced, they are still using the same crude methods which have been in use since the first chick was hatched by other than the use of hens.

The eggs are placed in large ovens, built somewhat on the lines of the old Dutch ovens one sees pictured in the books of years ago. The temperature is judged by the attendant thrusting his hand in the oven, and although their methods are crude in the extreme, the Egyptian poultryman has become so expert at the business that failures are rare. It is estimated that several million eggs are hatched in this way yearly, the people for many miles around bringing their eggs to the ovens which are operated by experts.

Modern artificial incubation, however, is a comparatively new thing.

Fifteen years ago an incubator was a neighborhood curiosity worth going miles to see, and for which many predicted failure.

That it is not a failure is clearly shown by the fact that there are upward of two million incubators now in successful operation. One manufacturer alone claims that there are 350,000 of his machines now in operation, and he is but one of more than fifty manufacturers making and selling incubators and brooders.

Some incubators, like the razors which are made to sell and not to shave, are made to sell and not to hatch.

In buying an incubator it is not advisable to buy a cheaply constructed machine, for it is a waste of time and money. It will never give good results and is a source of trouble from the

time they are started until the final disappointment on the day it is expected to hatch. Not only are they a source of trouble and annoyance, but there is a constant danger of fire while they are running, while with a properly constructed machine there is practically no danger.

There are two types in common use, the hot water and the hot air. As the names imply, one is heated by hot water and the other by hot air, which is the only difference.

In the hot water machines a set of pipes is located directly over the eggs and the heat radiates downward from these pipes through which the hot water circulates, starting from a supply tank which is heated by a lamp, and returning to the tank to be reheated.

The hot air machine is heated by the hot air from the lamp circulating through a large flat drum located in the upper part of the egg chamber, the heat being diffused from above just as the heat from the hen is applied from above.

Nature seldom makes a mistake, and while man may improve on the methods of Nature, his methods must work in harmony with her ways.

In order that the germ in which the spark of life lies dormant may be closest the source of heat at all times during the period of incubation, the germ is attached to the yolk of the egg which contains sufficient oil to make it light enough to float on the white, so that whatever way the egg may be turned the yolk is always uppermost, hence nearer the breast of the hen.

That is why we apply the heat from the top instead of from the bottom or sides of the incubator—so that the greatest heat may be closest to the germ which it warms into life.

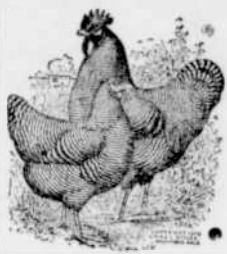

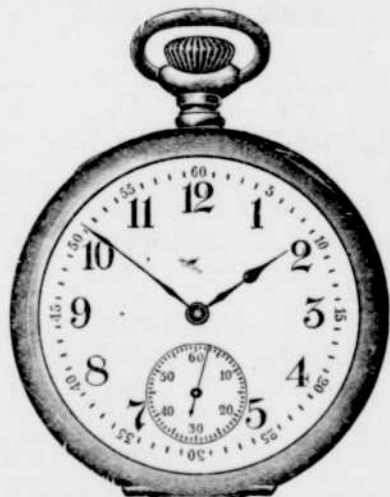
