Fire Permits
County Fire Warden A. V. Brown, of Forest Grove, was in the city Saturday, and tells the Argus that permits to burn slashings do not cost farmers a cent, as the state pays the expenses of the warden. The state forester has endeavored to have the county court appoint all supervisors to deputy wardenships, but this has not been done as yet. If you want an ordinary slashing burned you can write Mr. Brown, at Forest Grove, and he will grant the permit, unless it is in the heavily timbered districts, when he will visit the place and inspect the premises, ascertaining the advisability of burning at the time.

If you have a slashing to burn, it will be well to take no chances, as the penalty runs from \$50 to \$500. Hillsboro Argus
