**GET THE FAIR SPIRIT**

Also the "Be-Fair" Spirit, Says the Secretary of the Clarke County Fair

J. O. Wing, secretary-manager of the Clark County (Wash.) Fair Association, says:

Get the fair spirit. Try to grasp the "why" the fairs are held, "why" many enterprising citizens are giving their time and money to build them up and make them a success; go further and get the "be-fair" spirit also, and you will get much enjoyment from your visit and your connection with the fair. Unless you do this you will lose much of the benefit of the fair.

Do not hurry. Arrange your visit systematically, otherwise you are liable to overlook something that you would be much interested in and from which you would derive much benefit. If you see a product that is new to you, and you are a farmer, get a touch with the exhibitor and learn all you can about it. If you see a better product of any kind than you are growing, ask yourself "why" you can not do as well, and resolve that you will do so. Ask the other fellow "how he did it."

In the stock department ask the "man" "why" he is growing that kind of stock, then ask yourself "why" am I not growing as good or better?

If you have no decided opinion as to the breed you prefer, study the different breeds carefully and try to decide which are best adapted to your conditions, get the views of different breeders on the subject, make a note of what you learn and sift it out at your leisure.

Cultivate a friendly feeling toward all you come in contact with and you will increase your enjoyment, as well as that of others. These annual meets should be made a renewal of old acquaintances, and the forming of new ones that will be of lasting benefit.
