Gaston—Mass on the fourth Sunday of the month at 10:30 A. M.

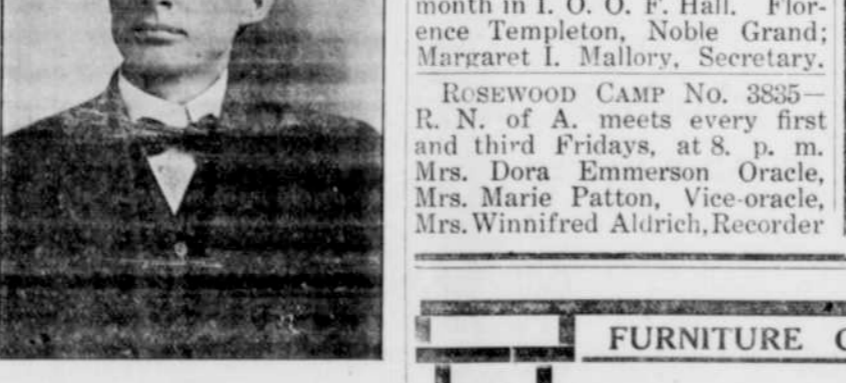
Note—A fifth Sunday in the month occurring, the time and place for the masses will be announced.
