**Notice to the Electors of the City of Forest Grove**

Chapter 323, of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for 1913, provide for a system of registration of electors of the State, and the Act provides for registration in municipalities similar to the City of Forest Grove, as follows:

"In all municipal corporations of this state, whose boundaries are not coincident with an election precinct or group of precincts, electors shall be registered for elections therein in the manner required by this Act for non-municipal elections, but the duties required by this Act to be performed by county clerks shall in that case be performed by the clerks or city recorders or other officers performing the duties usually performed by such officers, and all electors within any such municipal corporation shall register for municipal elections before such officer. Registration of electors in such last mentioned municipalities for municipal elections shall be distinct from registration for other elections and in addition thereto."

It will therefore be necessary for all electors of the City of Forest Grove to register before the Recorder for the coming city elections. Registration books will be open at the office of the City Recorder on Monday, October 27th, and will remain open until Saturday, October 29th, at five o'clock P. M. of said day.

**Proposals for Bids for Improvement**

Bonds of the City of Forest Grove, Oregon, Pacific Avenue Improvement.

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned at his office in the City of Forest Grove, Oregon, until Tuesday, the 11th day of November, 1913, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. of said date, for the sale of improvement bonds of the City of Forest Grove, Oregon, at not less than par value and secured interest for the whole or any part of the sum of \$5,837.44, said bonds to be issued in denominations of \$500, except Bond No. 1, which is to be issued in the sum of \$337.44. Each bond is to be dated November 1, 1913, payable in ten annual installments, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, interest and principal payable in United States gold coin at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Forest Grove, Oregon.

Provided, that the City of Forest Grove reserved the right to take up and cancel such bonds with accrued interest at any semi-annual coupon period, at or after one year from the date of such bonds.

Said bonds are issued under authority of the charter of Forest Grove, Oregon, and of Chapter 3, of Title 25, of Lord's Oregon Laws, for improvement of a certain street and parts of said street, said city, and the proceeds of the sale of said bonds will be used for the improvement in part for said improvement. Bidders will be required to submit a

a flat bid, without conditions, except as to the regularity of the issue of bonds, and to submit with their bids a certified check, certified to by a responsible bank, equal to five per cent of the face value of the bonds, payable to the Mayor of the City of Forest Grove, as liquidated damages, in case such bidder withdraws his bid or fails or neglects to enter into the contract to take and pay for said bonds according to the terms of his bid, and of the ordinance authorizing the issue of bonds and of this notice. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved by the City of Forest Grove.

**County Court News**

Floyd Fessler is suing Ione Larsen Fessler for divorce, and claims as his grounds cruel and inhuman treatment, and actions unbecoming a lady and wife. Intoxicants are mentioned and also going about with other men is the plaintiff's main charge. This and other reasons Fessler asks to be freed from Ione Fessler. They were married at Kalama, Washington June 24, 1913. There being no property or children involved.

D J Cooper sues Van Walters, et ux for \$764 and int, however plaintiff claims receiving \$50 on account and mentions \$75 as attorney's fees the note in evidence was dated Dec., 12, 1912, and bears interest at 6 per cent.

Anna Parker plaintiff vs D. C. Whiting et al, action for money amounting to about \$400 and interest at 8 per cent and also asks \$75 as attorney's fee.

John Gaarde, plaintiff vs Harry Kuehne action for money. Mr. Gaarde worked for defendant between May 14th 1913 and Oct 21, 1913 and is entitled to \$122.10 only \$25 having been paid on this labor account and is suing for the balance.

Hillsboro Commercial bank, a corporation plaintiff vs John H-ward note delivered to Peoples' Store, note amounting to \$500 due in 1 year, was afterwards transferred, this note draws 8 per cent interest \$100 attorney fees are asked. This revives the important decision rendered a few months back, more or less interest is centered at this time.

Hillsboro Commercial Bank plaintiff vs J Bartlett, also action for money. During 1912 about March 20th gave note to Peoples' Store for \$1000 at 6 per cent due in 18 months and attorney fees.

C L Hinman, plaintiff vs R. G. Allison, et ux. Action for money. On February 13, 1913, defendant gave plaintiff note for \$98.45 due 90 days after date. \$30 attorney fees.
