

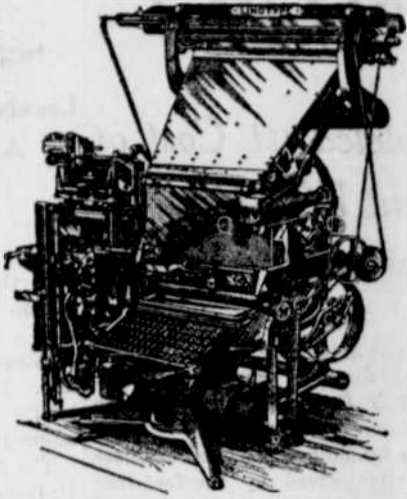

#### ICED BEVERAGES WITH TEA.

LUNCHEON MENU. Mince of Beef and Potatoes. Scalloped Eggplant. Peach Shortcake. Pot Cheese. Sliced Tea.

BEVERAGES which have the merit of being both cooling and refreshing may be made with tea. Every family has its favorite variety of tea and its own method of making it. Some suggestions for preparing these beverages may not be amiss, however.

Iced Tea.—Make fresh tea double its usual strength. Let it stand for five minutes. Place a thin slice of lemon in the bottom of each glass and one heaping teaspoonful of sugar. Fill the glasses with ice very finely chopped; then pour tea over the ice.
