Hygrometers Installed at High School — Prof. Sweetzer of the University of Oregon has sent three air hygrometers to the High school building.

He is making several tests throughout the state for the purpose of recording the amount of moisture in the air which is supplied by the various heating systems in use in the public school buildings. One of the hygrometers is placed on the outside of the building, one at the air intake of the room and the other at a central point to get an average humidity. Readings on all of these instruments are taken three times a day. The physics class has been testing the humidity by other apparatus and comparing the results with the present readings.
