**NURSE INSPECTS SCHOOLS**

**Finds Sanitation First-Class—46 Pupils Have Symptoms of Adenoids**

During the past week a nurse in the employ of the State Board of Health was in Forest Grove to inspect the public schools. The state keeps her in the field to discover children who are more or less defective because of bad vision, bad teeth, adenoids, etc. If any of these defects were found in the child the parent was recommended to have them examined and treated by a physician. Her report was also made upon the sanitation of the school buildings.

A copy of the report of the Forest Grove schools was filed by Superintendent Inlow, which shows that the sanitary condition of the schools is first-class. The methods of weekly disinfection and oiling of the floor met with much approval. The percentage of children not physically normal is about the same as found in other towns of this size. Of the 537 children in the schools 46 were found with symptoms of adenoids, 36 with enlarged tonsils, five with granulated eyelids and 16 who were temporarily out because of a contagious skin affection, which has been going the rounds among the school children.

He had been in poor health for some time, and thinking to better his health he moved to California about a year ago, but received no benefit.

She was born at Dexter, Maine, and when small moved with her parents to Michigan, where she married A. J. Raymond. The Raymond family moved to Oregon in 1891.

Wash.; A. J. Raymond, Thatcher; M. E. Raymond, Chehalis; Clyde Raymond, Aberdeen; David Raymond, Vancouver; Guy Raymond, and Mrs. Otto Strohmer, of Thatcher.
