to restrain, but only to regulate, and was therefore not in conflict with the state law, was disposed of by Judge Belt summarily, he holding that the regulation provided was an unreasonable and void one, and one not necessary to the preservation of the public welfare, safety and morals.

"The decision practically divests the city of its power to regulate theaters, other than the imposition of a reasonable license fee"
