Lloyd Folger of Spokane visited at the home of his uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Ives, several days last week.


The Gamma Sigmas of P. U. enjoyed a Thanksgiving banquet at Gamma hall last Thursday evening, according to the P. U. Index.
